SAFETY CHECKLIST							
All doors/windows with access to pool closed and locked	Never leave child unattended in or around water						
All gates to pool locked and never propped open	Establish a no adult, no swimming rule						
Remove all toys and objects in/around pool or near fence	Enroll your child in swim lessons and know their swimming ability						
Establish a designated water watcher whenever in/around water	Make sure everyone wears a US Coast Guard approved lifejacket						
Fully empty inflatable pools and	Learn CPR
